

later on because they didn't get any good out of them. I always feel I'd rather they hate me now than hate me later. I'd rather they look back later and be thankful for what I gave them. And so that is a principle of the old Princeton Seminary which we have endeavored to carry on here.

But when we talk about scholarship we don't simply mean a lot of work. There is much work involved in scholarship, but scholarship means a careful, accurate way of seeking to find results, a way of testing things and examining and seeing what the evidences are, and getting all the evidence. Oh, it is so easy to take a certain point and then you take an argument against it, . . .

. . . some of the men left Princeton and I was one who left with them, and founded a new seminary, I was there for eight years before ~~coming~~ ^{we come} to Faith. And at that institution there was a strong stand for the Word of God such as we desire to take here, but there was an attitude from which I reacted rather strongly (1) at the end of those 8 years, and that attitude which ~~was~~ inculcated among the students was, here are the eight faculty members, these are the greatest scholars in the world (1 1/4)

what they say is the last word and ~~we~~ ^{you} should take it. They have the proof, they have given it to you, and you take it. That was the attitude which was inculcated. And I reacted very strongly against it, and ever since Faith was founded, I have stressed, don't follow any man, don't follow me, follow the Scriptures, follow the Lord, and if you get the habit of following a man, no matter how good a man is, that man is going to die, or the Lord will take him away, or you will be somewhere where he isn't, and if you have the habit of following a man, you are apt to pick the wrong man to follow, after a while, follow the Lord, don't follow us. And so our stress has always been, learn to go to Scriptures, and see
