really out-and-out for the Lord, you dare going to be foreign missionary. If you

are not a foreign missionary you are not really out-and-out for the Lord. /KWell, now

if you're pretty much for the Lord, you're not quite as much as a foreign missionary would be, well, maybe you'll be an evangelist, and then if you're only a little bit for the Lord, then you may be a pastor, and then perhaps very little, you might be a professor, in a theological seminary. And what is the result? We took our people that were on fire for the Lord and we took them off to the mission field, to do a great work, for God, and to build up wonderful churches over there, and we put the people that had not zeal for the Lord in to be professors in our theological seminaries and they trained the next generation, and today you find all over the world that these wonderful missionary churches that were founded by those great godly men of a generation ago, are today being taken over by the people who have been trained under unbelievers in the seminaries in this country. We believe we should all have missionary vision, and we should all be interested in winning wouls in this country, but that each one of us should look into his own heart to see what abilities God has given us, and should study the word and try to find the place where God wants you, and wa God wants some of us as missionaries and some of us evangelists, and some as pastors, and some as scholars, and God wants all to have a thorough-going consecration and utter devotion to Him and we need this devotion in these fields of teaching, and of the (6 1/4)in the mission field. I do not mean to criticize those people who had a great missionary vision but to say that we shouldn't have run down other parts of the Lord's work, because God needs consecrated men in every one of these matters.

I knew two people some time ago, one of whom felt that the only thing that

mattered is evangelism and he had a smattering ability at languages and a great gift

at studying the Scriptures. But he felt that didn't matter, all that mattered was

evangelism, and he went out and became a fourth-rate evangelist, accomplishing
