Wise In Their Own Eyes

**TREMENTE** Socrates, the Greek philosopher, once declared that he, himself, was the wisest man in all of Greece. He said that everyone else in Greece knew nothing but thought he knew something. He, himself, knew nothing and knew that he knew nothing: therefore, he was wiser than anyone else. Clearly the man who thinks he knows everything is the hardest one to teach. Jesus said that except we become as little children we cannot enter the Kingdom of Heaven. Wisdom in our own eyes is apt to lead to foolishness in the eyes of others. We must hold fast to what we know that is true but we must push forward to receive new truths.

There is no source of new truth to be compared with God's Word. The Bible, and the Bible alone, gives us the visions of eternal matters that we so badly need.
