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this matter. Perhaps it was wasted even if it in itself didn't bring much, but I think we've opened up the subject perhaps more than before. Welve seen certain aspects of it which--I don't think we are ready to be dogmatic about any of these and I think we want to consider them and look further into them and examine them, and our question isn't again, "Does the Scripture teach a pretribulation rapture or does it teach a post-tribulation rapture?" Our question is, "Is there enough evidence in the Scripture to enable us to know whether it is pre-tribulation or post-tribulation and if so, how strong is it? Does it definitely look one way or the other, and which way is it? Personally, I must say as far as I've seen yet(I've heard many arguments given trying to tear down arguments against the pre-tribulation rapture, and I think many/arguments for it have been excellently torn down and I think a very fine service has been rendered in doing that, but I personally have not seen any positive evidence for post-tribulation rapture and I have seen quite a lot of what appears to me as rather definite evidence for pre-tribu-Now maybe it won't stand. It deserves examination carelation rapture. fully, but that is just a very tentative appraisal which I would give at this particular point.
