The day of judgment, that day, but you look at the passages, I looked up in the last half hour most of the passages he referred to, they are referring to resurrection of the just or the resurrection of the lost, there will be the resurrection of both the just and the unjust. It does not say there will be a general resurrection. And I think that revelation 20 makes it very clear that there will be a difference in time. The rest of the dead lived not until the thousand years were completed. It explicitly says that. And of course they speak of the general judgment, and Berkhof gives as an evidence of the judgment, the great white throne judgment. We have in Revelation 20. But there is not a suggestion of anybody being saved. The great white throne judgment is a judgment of the lost, to show that they are lost, to show that certain people are lost, and the books are open, and (3 1/2) but there is no evidence whatever of anybody (Student). It is an objection raised by those who oppose pre-millennialism, that pre-millennialism believes in the resurrection. That is their objection to pre-millennialism, and I am saying that - I am not giving these points as the objections that I have to pre-millennialism, ~~an~~ but objections others said that I do not think is justified. And personally I believe that the Bible clearly teaches that there will be two resurrextions. Not one. But this is a point which they talk about a great deal here. Where it speaks of the goats and the sheep. On the other hand you have clearly stated in John, he that believes on him shall not come into the judgment, but is already passed from death unto life.
