He receives God's word so he is a true prophet. It would be wrong to say this man is not a false prophet. He pretended to be a prophet when he was not. So we have both kinds of prophets in the account. (Student). That reminds me of the case where a we middle aged woman in a church, the pastor (2 1/2) she went to a man in the church, and said, God has revealed to me that you are to marry me. The man said, well, that is very interesting and very fine, if God reveals the same thing to me we will procede to get married. It was a very good answer, I think. The message from God is

(3) A prophet presents God's message. (Student). God has given him His word. He believed firmly God had given him His word. Then he should follow it and not let any man lead him astray no matter how wonderful the man was. If he had not received the word from God, he'd be in a different situation altogether.

But he had received a direct message from God. God wanted him to follow God and not follow any man. It is like one of us. We read in the Bible, and the Bible says some thing, and we read it, and we understand it as clear, and then some man comes along, and says, no, that is not it at all. You must do something else. Well, that man may be a very persuasive speaker and he may persuade us to something else, but we can't stand before the judgment seat of Christ and say, this man, he has persuaded me that this is what I should do. God will say, what did my Word say, you sa read my Word. You saw what it meant. You are responsible for your reading the word. You can not excuse yourself for disobsying the Word by saying that some other man deceived you. It is up to you to decide for yourself, what the Word means, and not let any man

(4 1/2). (Student). The Lord does reveal Himself to most people. There is no question of it. In this particular case, the man had chosen to reveal himself directly to the man, and then God wanted a man to stam take what God had revealed to him and stand by it whatever he does. And God wants each of us to find what we find in the Word and stand by it no matter what any other human being says. One of our graduates went to another seminary to take some graduate work there, to get a doctor's degree. He wrote back. He said, my, the atmosphere is so different than Faith Seminary. He said, these students are taking subjects all the time, and they are studying books far more than they do at Faith. He says they will take a subject, what does this verse mean? And immediately they'll hunt through 50 commentaries and they'll find that
