And he is at this point a wonderful example for us, but a little later on, he shows a different character. My, when we were in the Presbyterian Church of the U.S.A. I used to hear men talk on how they would stand for the Lord no matter what happened. They would be absolutely true to His word. I used to hear wonderful declarations, counting on people to be loyal to Him, and some of those same men, when the pressure came, buckled under first; for fear of losing a pension. Buckled under and found it inconvenient to be present when the vote was taken, for fear they would lose their pension. It is easy to talk that way, but when th comes to actual the Lord wants that is what He (9 1/2).
