granted and try to fit it in. I think it is all right to get a theory and then see if you can fit the facts into the theory and if you find that the facts don't fit the theory then drop your theory—make theories and see if the facts fit, but if not drop the theory. The trouble is when you make a theory you are apt to force facts to fit, and that is exactly what they do right down the line. We should not build on a theory. The facts fall in line with the teaching of the N.T. — that this is God's will which was presented through His servant Moses. When we went to most of the objections we found that the answer was right there. When someone brings you an argument against Scripture always go to the Bible and see what it says. There is too much of this trying to explain different statements, instead of going and seeing exactly what the facts are. When you examine the facts, you will find there is much that we don't understand, but the Bible is a great Book which is an infinite, of which we don't know the whole background, but it is a book that will stand every test with the facts, and we can have confidence that the Bible is the Word of God.
