He works and works on the languages. I saw him again a few years ago, after not having seen him for many years, and I mentioned to him, I said, "Well, havexex you done work in languages?" "Oh, I've taken courses," he says, "in Aramaic, in Cuneiform, in Hieroglyphics, in all these, I've taken courses, and I've struggled, and I've gotten thwough," he windy said, "But," he said, "my real area is in the area of the actual excavations and the xx study of the material." Some have one ability; some have the We need, in all these different areas, to develop these values(?) that in which we are good. If y ou're good in study, and careful Bible study, fine. reaching people, If you are good in dealing with other peoples's problems, if you're good in/xxxxxixxx in winning people to particular aspects, stress the aspect in which you are good, but do not look with contempt upon the other aspects. Try to develop at least some EXXXXXX ability in other aspects. We need to develop balance in all of these matters. And so,

g. is in emphasizing one aspect we should avoid giving a false impression. How easy that is to do. We all want to stress the thing in which we are good. We fax feel the importance of it, and it may be kekken tremendously important. The aspect of the Lord's service, the part of His work in which we have particular gifts, N we want to stress, and we should. But, oh how important it is to avoid giving the impression that that's all that matters. Recognize the value of those aspects of Christian work in which you yourself are not particularly gifted, and try to develop yourself to a certain extent in them, even though you put your major emphasis on kheek developing those aspects in which you yourself are gifted.
