The time is now. Now is the day of salvation and now is the time when you can do it. Some times I'll sit down and the train is late and I have ten minutes to wait and I just want that train to come. Of course, once I get in it, why It's all right then but I just hate to wait and I sit there and oh, it seems terrible, and then I'll take out the Bible and I'll say, "Well, now, let's make this time count. Let's start in reading study here, " and the next thing I know I hear the train come all of a sudden and, "What, has it come already?" WAY. if you'll get into God's Word and get what He has there for you and utilize the moments in reading and study of God's Word you are preparing yourself for
