There are still others who read the Old Testament for the experiences of the people in ancient times, casting aside everything else as of no interest for us today. It is to them just like any other book from which they can select certain things of value and ignore the rest.

Then there are the modern Jews to whom the Old Testament is a book of wonderful words which they read in the orgginal Hebrew in their synagogues, and even if they don't understand the words, they receive great blessing from hearing the sounds. I fear many of our churches have the same attitude of $(6 \ 1/2)$. To other Jews it is principally a book of Law, which gives exact prescriptions as to how they should live, and that is all.
