

point, but the Bible was ahead of them all the time. When he said Abram had Camels in Egypt, it was no mistake,- it was the actual fact.

Well, you go on to the next chapter, where they come up out of Egypt, and Abram was very wealthy. They came up out of Egypt, and Lot was wealthy, too; we read in verse 3 that they camped where they had been before, between Bethel and Hai. We read in vs. 6 that "the land was not able to bear them, that they might dwell together: for their substance was great, so that they could not dwell together. And there was a strife between the herdmen of Abram's cattle and the hermen of Lot's cattle". Now it is easy to imagine what happened, especially if you have been there in Palestine. I am sure that one morning Abram's men went out at 5:30 in the morning, taking their sheep and their goats and their animals of every sort, and they went out to find good pasture. Here is a little spring, and some grass and good pasture, and Lot's men are there. They go a little further, and Lot's men are there,- Lot's men had gone out at 5 o'clock that morning, so at 5:30 when Abram's men came verything was taken, and they had to go on, and on, and on, and on, to get past Lot's men and find good pasture. And the result was they had to come back early, in order to get back at a decent hour. So they said, We are not going to have this experience tomorrow; so the next day they went at 4:30, and when Lot's men cameout at 5, they found the good pasture all taken, and they were the ones who had to go way beyond. So the next morning they said they would go at 4, and pretty soon they would not have been going to bed at all at night (Laughter), so it is easy to see how it came about that there was a strife between the herdmen of Abram's cattle and the herdmen of Lot's cattle. Then in vs. 8 we read this story which has been told everywhere that there has been a Sunday School, at least anywhere in the United States that there has been a Sunday School I am sure this story is told. Abram came to Lot and they went walking out along that hill country between Bethel and Hai, and Abram said to Lot, "Let there be no strife, I pray thee, between me and thee, and between my herdmen and thy herdmen, for we are brethren. Isn't
