time and so I must rush out that door as sonn as I finish speaking, or whether it will be late tonight and I can stay around and greet some of you as I would like to. Possibly someone is going to phone on my behalf and ask the railroad station to make a similar prediction at 8:30, but I have found that even when the railroad station predicts that a train is going to be on time sometimes you stand around 20 minutes in the station before the train goes. It is difficult to predict the future. I happened to pick up a copy of an old magazine somewhere, and I saw a subject on the front that looked interesting to me. It was January 1940, and the title on the front of the cover said. "A famous astrologer tells what is going to happen in 1939, so then I looked at the date on the magazine and the magazine was dated January 1939. I thought it would be interesting in January 1940 to see what an astrologer had said in January 1939 was going to happen that year, so I looked into it. It must have made very interesting reading in January 1939, but it was still more interesting in January 1940.
