The first was, the comand of Jesus. Jesus is our king. The King of every Christian. And the command He gave was not to go into the world and build a perfect social order. The command was to go into all the world and win them to me. Go out into t all the world and win them to the Lord. That was the command, the great commission. Then, the apostolic church, we noticed, showed a remarkable lack of interest in social improvement, and I thought that the evidences from that. Many w more could be brought. Third, MEXXX despite the lack of direct interest in social betterment, the Christian church x has been by far the greatest force for social betty betterment in the world's kix history. And we noticed a few of the many many instnces that could be brought of that. Fourther, this was the one on which I was questioned later. The New Testament uniformly speaks of Christians as strangers and pilgrims, Their homeks is not here, but they seek a country. We are not Jesus' citiznes in the sense that He is today ruling over the United States. He is ruling over xxx those individuals who recognize Him as King. He wants us to win others to recognize Him as King, to accept Him as Saviour. And He waxwixx wants us to stand for the principles of His kingdom wherever we can. But, I think it is vital that we recognize that according to the Biblip//cal teaching, Satan is the prince of this world. And that therefore we cannot expect in this age to make any wowstantxorx continent, country, or even town entirely Christian. God has not promised it. He has not promised us that we will be able so completely to end the evangelization of one city that we will then be justified in giving the bulk of our time to improving the social conditions within that a city.

Satan goes about as a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour, and also is an angel of light, to deceive the very elect. If you look at the history of the missionary movement of the last two centurgies, you could easily gove way to despair. Country after country, where the Gospel came in, and thousands were won to the Lord, and it looked as if the whole nation would become thoroughly Christin in another fifty years, and today modrnism spreads through those countries and the high, comparatively high character,
