7. Facility in various types of practical Christian Work

A medical course is made/not simply of lectures about the various qualities of the human body and the things that can be done to help them, but also includes a great deal of definite practice. Most every medical course is followed by a year of internship in which the skills learned in the course are practiced under expert direction. All too often the Christian worker simply learns material and then goes out with little knowledge of practical methods of usingit. If the Seminary work is to be effective, the practical student should be doing practical work constantly and there should be supervision over it to be sure that he is learning from it. The practical work should be so arranged that every student will get practice in various types of Christian work and will learn the principle things needed to do them effectively.

One aspect of that tands to be neglected is the aquisition of skill in getting ideas across to particular groups of different types. After all, this is a very vital part of any Christian worker. It is vital, therefore, that ways be thought out of givin KK students actual practical experience in gettin g ideas across and the acquisition of a certain amount at least in teaching. This should be included in some way withing the regular Seminary course and many special types of practical Christian work should be made available and students compelled to have at least a little experience in every one of them before receiving the Seminary degree.
