.....But if you are not pure in heart, if you are not hungering and thirsting after righteousness, if you don't have the characteristic of the salt, of the light, we can easily become darkenss and be worthless. He wants us to the attitude that God wants us to have we make a mistake and we think of it as something in between two different things. It isn't. The two equally stressed, and you can't stress either of them too much, youcan't possibly, it is a matter of They both have to be stressed, and that is so in many aspects of our life and service to Christ. I thought this though would fit in rather nicely with a little report of my recent absense from the seminary in what I've been doing. I know you have rejoiced since I have been away, because you have less clesses then, but when I come back and make them up, then perhaps you'd prefer I stayed longer. before, but this week and a half now was in two very distinct adtivigies. I thought you'd be interested in them. I left here Wednesday night, and I went to Chicago, and there in Chicago I had three extremenly interesting days. I was at the LaSalle Hotel where I was furnished a room by the Oxford University Press, and there were 8 others, 9 others counting the representative of the press, for which they furnished rooms there, and we had come from thousands of miles apart, in various directions, but we were gathered there for **three** those three days, and I had had the impressions that we were going to have two sessions, two and a half hours, a day together, each day, but know when we got there we found it necessary to finish the work we had to do then to have about three hours in the morning and four in the afternoon, and three in the evening, and so you see I wasn't wasting any time While I was there.
