The idea of superstantial in the douay version $5\frac{3}{4}$ in their belief they are actually feeding on the body of Christ, but we don't believe that.....6....., but we do have the Gospel of John where Jesus said, Except ye eat of my flesh, and drink of my blood, ye have no part in me. And we must partake of the body and blood of Christ $6\frac{1}{4}$ And the fact that this peculiar word is used, when we don't know what it means, and literally it could be supersubstantial, it seems to me to at least mean that we are justified that this bread we have here is not $6\frac{1}{2}$, but it includes all we need, and it is $6\frac{3}{4}$and He wants us to pray to Our Father to give us the food day by day which we need, and which we won't have apart from Him, but He also wants us to pray to Him to give us the things we need most of all, and most of all..... $7\frac{1}{4}$that which is intended for our growth $7\frac{1}{2}$ which Jesus Christ the living bread gives us in our daily.....
