and bringing them to the surface so they can be faced and brought into relation to the cross of Christ! What a marvellous privilege Christians have. Of course if the Christian does not avail himself of this privilege **the** and lets these emotions, thoughts, and worries lie so buried within his subconcious that they grow and fester there he could get into a situation where only a trained psychologist can find them and root them out and relieve him of his misery. But a Christian has no need to get into this situation. Paul has told us here how we can look day by day to the Spirit to cleanse us from these feelings and bring them to light, and to make intercession before the Throne that we cannot utter.

Of course this is not a privilege which belongs to every person. This privilege belongs only to those who have availed themselves of themarvellous teaching contained in the earlier chs. of The Book of Romans. Every one of us has sinned and turned away from God. The Bible teaches us that Jesus died on the cross and that we can put our trust in him and find our sins taken away because he bore them for us. What a privilege it is to have the Bible to study; to get its marvellous principles that have been the foundation of our national greatness. How wonderful it is to know that we canpersonally come to the Christ of the Bible, lay our sins at his feet, know that He bore them on the cross, and through him enter into newness of life.

On the next three Saturdday nights we shall look into other aspects of our relation to the Bible and the reason we can trust it and know that it is inerrant and dependable no matter what presentday modernists, present-day secularists, present-day S.S. writers or present-day enemies of God's Word may say!

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
