Thesee all died in faith, not having received the promises, but having seen them afar off, and were persuaded of them, and embraced them, and confessed that they were strangers and pilgrims on the earth. For they x that say such things d declare plainly t at they seek a country. And truly, if they had been mindful of that country from whence they came out, they might have a had opportunity to have returned. But now they desire a better country, that is, an heavenly: wherefore God is not ashamed to be called their God: for He hath prepared for them a city. This is faith ... faith is the substance of things schoped for, the evidence of things not seen. Many people have the idea that faith is simply credulity. You just beiebelieve a thing and believe it strong enough and you have faith. That is not faith at all. I had heard not so long ago about a person who want to a healing service. This person had a een cancer on the face. And he was told that if he had faith he could be cured of this cancer. You just have to have faith and you will be cured of it. And so the person set to ox work to cronvince himself that he was being cured of the cancer. Someone went to see him some time later and he would hardly let them into the house. The cancer had grown so big, it was awful. It eou covered the whole face--there was a stinck from it. He said I just don't have enoughk faith. I must have more faith. That is now- not what faith is. That is credulity. Faith is not simply believing something. Faith is believing something that is based

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
