And you we look on down to verse 42 and you read Wath-Watch therefore, for you kno-know not what hour your Lord/might-come, doeth come, verse 44 says Be ye also ready, for in such a n hour as you think not, the Son of man come th, and the next cah-bx chapter, verse 13 says Watch therefore for ye know neither the day nor the hour when the Son of Man cometh, there are a dozen cases in the New Testament whekre this exhortation k is given, but well, if yours don't know the day nor the hour, we don't know that it is going to be this year, he sas-says in such an hour as ye think not , the Son of Man cometh. He wants us to be ready whenever he comes, but he wanst-wants us to plan our lives as if we had; a k whole lie to live, and if He finds ME you faithfully preparing to make your life to count for the utmost to for him, he will be just as happy as if \$\stimes\$ He found you having rushed into phases of work before you xx weer -were ready and neglected neglected the training that this word, would be so useful. Incidentally, this English is a little bit confusing, / watch therefore, because we can get an idea from it that is different from k what the Greek means . We say, Watch , so and so is coming through , let's watch, and we are abt to be at the wird own, watching all the time. That is not what this word watch means. This word watch in the Greek means, to be wide awake -tbat-that --be vigilant, be on the job and the illustration/he gives, k like in verse 45, Matt. 25 24:45, Who then is a faithful and-wil-wise servant, whom his lord has made Lord xook over his household, to give them meat, that's old English English for foods, in due season, blessed is that servant whom His Mx Lord when he cometh shall find so doing. To watch means to be on the job serving the Lord. It doesn't mean to be aab-abandoning the task that he wants you to do
