

These titles do not necessarily indicate who the human author is and many of the books of the Bible --- I have no idea who wrote Hebrews, and I don't care. Some great scholars have thought Paul wrote it; others equally Christian and equally great scholars have been equally convinced Paul did not write it. I know God inspired it and it is true.

I have no idea who wrote Genesis. I don't know any reason he might not have. I know of no reason why Moses might not have written Genesis. I think it is entirely possible Moses wrote Genesis. I think it is equally possible that one of Joseph's sons wrote Genesis. It ends with the death of Joseph. There is no reason it could not have been one of them. It is equally possible that Moses' father (in law) wrote Genesis or it is possible that after Moses' death after he settled in the land somebody else wrote Genesis. I don't know who wrote Genesis. But this I know that God wrote Genesis, and it is entirely Mosaic in the sense that God wrote it.

There are many statements that are quoted as God told Moses to write as "Moses said these words," etc. I believe that everything the Bible says is true. But I don't know of any statement that proves Moses wrote Genesis, but I do know God inspired whoever he was and Genesis is absolutely true.

Now here is a book, Understanding the OT, by Bernhard W. Anderson, Prof. of Biblical Theology at Drew University. This book is advertised as being a textbook in hundreds of colleges. This book the theory of the Pentateuch as taught day J, E, D, P documents taught as established fact.

This afternoon it was mentioned to us that in the Covenant Material that five Reformed Churches have gotten it; it is specifically taught as established fact. Prof. === Dr. Cyrus Gordon, Prof. of Mediterranean studies in Brandeis University made a statement that was published in Christianity Today in the last few years that friends who were professors in the theological seminaries, Catholic theological seminaries, and Jewish theological seminaries, who held to the existence of the J, E., D. and P documents as something that anyone must believe. There can be no compromise on this fact! And Dr. Gordon said, The evidence for this theory is absolutely non-existent. I am sure that he is correct in that statement. It is purely an assumption. Nobody ever discovered any copy of the J document, E., or the P document. I don't say the D document because the D document is almost the same as the Book of Deuteronomy but no one of these others with just the parts that they put in separated from the parts that they has ever been found, nor has any statement of Christ referring to such documents ever been found. It is a theory that came from the imagination of certain liberal scholars === German scholars between about 1870 and 1880 mostly, but it is today taught as established fact, and there is nothing today that does more to destroy Christian faith. It is even taught in many of our high schools today. In required courses in high school as established fact!
