But it is very easy to misunderstand a type. You can get ~~get~~ a general ideal ^{from} of a type but you have to be told more or less of what it stands for before it continues to present that idea to you. I saw a writing by someone who was very indignant of the fact that on our dollar bills, I believe, that we now have ~~not only a picture of~~ a picture not only of the front of the great seal of the U.S. but of the back of it, and that back of it was made long ago ^{I believe} and was not much used until within the last 30 years. And on that picture ^{on} of the back it shows a ~~pyramid~~ pyramid with a break on the top of it - there is a little space, and they said this is a liberal, socialistic idea that has been put into our dollar bills, showing that our civilization is incomplete and needs to be changed by the adding of the ^{pinacle} pinical of the pyramid and brought into a communistic and socialistic situation. Well you can interpret it that way, but we don't have any direct access to the minds of the people who made that. We don't have to interpret it that way.
