III The Situation at the Beginning of the Book of Numbers.

The Book of Num. is not the complete picture of Israel's milderness journey.

The book is very properly titled in Heb. "in the wilderness." It is primarily a record of Israel's wilderness journey, but that does not mean that it is the whole
