There is one more head under this that I want to look at rather briefly although it covers a large amount of material. That is No. 13 -- Presentation of the Law.

This covers the last hapf of Exodus which begins with the 10 commandments the and/presentation of the specifice laws for the journey through the wilderness and then the book of Lev. with the many detailed laws about sacrifiece. And then after the Book of De Num. we have the Bk. of Deut. in which the law is repeated.
