 I've got to get rid of it." He put maybe \$50 worth of material ~~xx~~ into it, and  
 hours and hours of time. So he said, ~~xxxx~~ "I've got to get rid of that. Do  
 you know anybody who might be interested in a truck like this. So they found  
~~xxxxxxx~~ another fellow who offered to give him \$5 for it; so he gave it to him.  
 He didn't have any liberty. And then a few days later he had liberty to build  
 another one; and thus he had a feeling that he had liberty to do this, or  
~~xxx~~ didn't have liberty to do that. Now God ~~mightxxx~~ might lead us through a  
 feeling that we have. I don't say this is a false way; I say it's a the (?)  
 half-true (?) (not clear) way, perhaps in this case a tenth-true (?) way,  
 because our feelings are about the poorest guide we can get for what is wise to  
 do in life. But how often people feel as if God is going to give them a feeling  
~~xxxxxxx~~ that will tell them whether they should do this or do that. It is  
 comparatively rare that that is the way that the Lord leads us, and so it is  
 something to beware of. Mr. Koontz was telling me this morning of a fellow  
 he knew in college who belonged to a certain group which laid great stress on  
 the Lord's leading us at every ~~xxxxx~~ step. And he said this fellow ~~xx~~ had  
 an appointment to preach in a church, and when Sunday ~~xxxxxxx~~ morning came  
 he had the feeling it wasn't the Lord's will he should go and preach there  
 so he just didn't show up. And very often we have strong feelings one way  
 or another, which, if we trace them back, are due to some sort of a fear or  
 hesitance on our part, or to a relation to some ~~xxxx~~ past experience or somethingg
