But here we read in Num. 11:11, "It came to pass on the 20th day of the second mo. in the second yr. that the cloud was taken up from off the tab. of the testimony and the children of Israel took their journey out of the wilderness of Sinai. So it was the 2nd mo. of the 2nd yr. after they left Egy. when they left Sinai. And so it would seem that they must have stayed at Sinai for at least a yr. and a half, perhaps for 2 full yrs. It was a long stay at Sinai. We see then how important it is. There were many things done at Sinai. It was an important part of the wilderness journey. God was not ready -- Or rather they were not ready for God to take them direct from Egy. up to the land of Israel. They were not ready to see war so they could not go by the shortest route, but they were not ready to know how to be truly the people of God. They were not ready to learn the lessons that they needed to learn during the Pilgrimage journey. They were not ready to carry out all that he had in mind for them.
