THE STING OF DEATH

Bible Reading: I Corinthians 15:50-58

O death, where is thy sting? O grave, where is thy victory? I Corinthians 15:55.

One of the mysteries that the unassisted human mind cannot explain is the mystery of death. Until we experience the death of a loved one, we have no conception of what such an occurrence means. Until a person has had the experience of seeing one who is dear to him disappear from life and the body become merely a corpse, he cannot even imagine the shock that such an event brings.

His purposes are certain to be accomplished in the end.

As far as the non-Christian is concerned, the grave is indeed the end of all his hopes. But the Christian has victory over the grave, through Jesus Christ our Lord.
