men kept very quiet. They waited for the proper time to make an uprising.

The time came when they heard of Allies advances. From the West the armies of ahe British, the French and the Americans had come within == were only 100 to 150 miles away. Soon they might reach them and they would have hope of rising up and getting rid of the foreign conquerors. Bitter news arrived. The great Soviet Army was only 30 miles away to the East. Any day now the Soviets could be expected to launch an attack upon the city. And uprising within the city would make it far easier for their liberators to gain possession of the city and Poland would again == and Warsaw would again be free. So the signal was given. Suddenly in all parts of the city people began to rise up against the representatives of the conquerors. Planes from the West dropped supplies and ammunition to them. They had faith that the Soviet army == armies would march in=an=a and attack, and soon victory would be theirs. The patriots fought desperately. The comparatively small number of German occupation troops however well equipped as they were were more than enough to take care of the patitiots. If only the Soviets would move and attack they would be delivered and the city would be free, but the soldiers === but the Soviet army remained where it was.
