

is ordinarily used for flesh for meat but it says it is never used of flesh used in sacrifice, in the LXX. That is a strong statement, and it is true that it does in dozens of cases the word krea is used in the LXX for the meat of the animals that are sacrifices. So I think that one would feel that the man has a very strong basis for saying this. Unfortunately he may have looked at 50 cases but did not look at one. Because I find that in Lev. 4:11 we are told what is to be done to the different parts of one of the particular sacrifices, and we read: "And the skin of the bullock and all his flesh, and his head, and legs and inwards..... even the whole bullock shall he carry forth without the camp unto a clean place where the ashes are poured out and burn him on the wood with fire." That certainly is flesh used in sacrifice. In that one case this word sarx is used for it. But some scholars have looked at maybe 50 cases and found that sarx is used of flesh or meat, in various connections, but he found many many cases where krea is used for sacrifices, so he says that sarx is never used for animal sacrifices. Well, here is one case. And one is enough to completely disprove a theory like that one. A negative statement is very very difficult to make about any thing.
