before the Lord could come back. Yet in spite of these pictures showing a considerable stretch of time the Lord had repeatedly given the urging that they must always be ready fmx "for ye know not the day nor the hour when your cap."L" It is hard to imagine that the vista given in Matthew 24 to 2 (nc) could possibly be completed in less than a few decades. Yet a century after the time of Christ one could easily imagine that this long period had passed. There had been wars and rumors of wars, nation had risen against nation, there had been persecutions, there had been real tribulation and suffering and martyrdom. Peter had been mm martyred. There would be now no obvious max reason why the exhortations of Christ should mx not have full effect.

Thus it would seem that Christ desired His disciples always to act as if He might come at analyzation any time, and to be ready because they did not know when He would come, but that after a a few decades after his time death they would have no reason to think that it might not be at any time. If there were certain clear premonitory signs of His coming what would be the point of these p frequent statement to always be ready "for ye know not the day nor the key hour."

So we would seem to have a clear teaching in the Scripture that the attitude of people is to be ready because they don't know when the Lord is coming back.
