He said to the woman what did you give him, did you give him too much, did; you give him exactly the right amount. She said I did exactly what; you said, she said I didn't have a dime, but I used two nickels.

I'd give an examination and I'd say, parse all the verbs in a verse and immediately I'd have five people come to me and say, did you want the verse translated or not? Well, all I said was to parse the verbs, I did not say to translate the verse.

But to read directions and get them exactly
