just how many of them are based on a misunderstanding, and with no realism whatever I had a man come to me and say

and I found

what it really is. It's just a very imperfect history of Egypt. Well I knew immediately that that man hadn't made much of a study of the Bible. Somebody had told him that the Bible said that the children of Israel came out of Egypt

and he decided the Bible

was a history of Egypt. (\$41/4)

And so that is the great essential solid bulwark of our course here, is the learning , understanding what the Bible teaches (4 1/2)

you can't do it, but you

can make a mighty tood try. We had a student a few years ago who went to another i institution where he could work toward his doctor's degree and I saw these fellows after they'd been there a couple of years and they told me this, they said, here, they said, the students are trained to go to commentaries and on a question they say well, this commentary says this, this one differs, and so on,

spend a great deal of times on that but when it comes to getting into the Bible and actually seeing what the Bible really says, they all $(5\ 1/2)$
