What a ring of truth there is in the accounts and yet how utterly it transcends any other life that has ever been lived or imagined. What fiction writer has ever produced a character like Jesus? Someone has said that it would take a Jesus to invent a Jesus. It is a marvellous proof of the truth of the Biblical account that the character therein portrayed is so beyond all possible effort of the human imagination.

Everyone who has studied the life of Jesus has seen that He is the Son of God, that He must be for no other could possibly live as He lived. Two men once rode together in a railroad train in America. Both were sceptics. ^{and one} One of them ^{was} a noted sceptic. The latter turned to his companion and said "Jesus was really a very remarkable man. Someone ought to write a book which would present him as he really was, a very remarkable man but only a man".
