Ged himself. And finally the extent to which this Book was considered inspired was to the very words themselves.

I believe that we have presented a very strong and almost conclusive argument for the Inspiration of the Old Testament from the New Testament. And we have left three passages in the New Testament which when excepted in detail according to sound rules of grammar will show conclusively that the writers of the New Testament and Christ considered the Old Testament which they knew as "The Scriptures" as the inspired Word of God. These passages are 2 Timethy 3:15-18; John 10:34 and following; I Peter 1:19-21. As it requires a detailed excepts to show the conclusiveness of the argument of these passages, and since such is not within the scope of this paper, we refer the reader to an excellent argument and excepts of these passages by Dr. Benjamin Brocking Warfield in the International Standard Bible Encyclopedia under the title of Inspiration.
