

and putting him in again. Sixty per cent of all crimes today are of people who have already served in prison. Our government is not performing its first duty that of protecting the lives of its citizens. The statement Jefferson made "life, and liberty." Well liberty is certainly second to life, but every person should have liberty to travel freely and safely in any part of the country. The same situation enters in. There are many things I'd like to do in Philadelphia in the evening but I don't go. I'd be taking a chance, with conditions down there as they are now. I simply don't go unless I'm with someone else at night. I do not have liberty in that regard

The thing that has produced our great affluence has been the liberty of people to put a small amount of money in a corporation along with other thousands of people, and then if the manager of the corporation succeeds or if they are not succeeding people withdraw their money and put it in something else. We have had that liberty. But ever since WW II a Corporation fails and you lose your money; you put your money in it and it succeeds and the government takes approx. 50% of its profits! Now that is certainly destroying the liberty of the people. That is put us in the kind of situation in which we are today.

That statement of T. Jefferson is very interesting: "life, liberty, and pursuit of happiness." He did not say "life, liberty and happiness." That is the attitude today. The govt. should provide for the life, liberty, and happiness of its people! It should take care of us from birth to death! It cannot do it. Happiness is dependent on many different factors. The govt. cannot provide happiness; it is absolutely impossible. But the govt. could protect a situation into which individuals would be free in any legitimate way to pursue happiness.

When our children are sometimes reprimanded for saying their grace before lunch in school, when teachings are given in schools that attack the Christian basis on which America was established, that denies the Bible, that interferes with our right to religious liberty, it is interfering. The govt. is interfering with our pursuit of happiness. It is not permitting us to pursue our happiness while at the same time permitting others to pursue their happiness.

In changing it to trying to give happiness to everyone, an impossible objective, the end is to cut down the happiness of most of the great bulk of the people because it is cutting down the opportunity for the pursuit of happiness.

Now what does all this mean for the church? Well as I said, the Christian is a citizen of heaven. It is not our duty to try to establish a perfect kingdom on earth. We cannot do it. But we do find that in the realm of material things the U.S. under this system which is called capitalism -- I don't think it is a good name but I don't know any other better to describe it -- under this system the U.S. has made such progress in a material way in the last 200 yrs. that was not made for at least 3000 years. Far beyond
