I would like to call your attention to the book of Matthew, ch. 9:35-38, (reading text)

In this passage we have called strongly to our attention
the compassion of Jesus. He was moved with compassion on them.

I would that everyone in this room had some realization of the
compassion of Jesus because everyone of us realizes that it it
was not for Jesus' compassion for us --- each one of us individually
-- we would be on our way to eternal destructoon. Each of us
We have
realizes that we deserve eternal destruction. If we had followed
our sinful thoughts and dinful desires and yet Jesus had compassion on us to such an extent that he was willing to lay down
His life on Calvary's life on Calvary's cross that we might life.
And if Someone has done that for you, what can you do to show
your love to Him? What a tremendous display of His compassion.
that He has showed to each of us.

But this morning I'm not so particularly going to speak of
Jesus compassion to us, tho that is something each of us should
constantly think about, because it should be the mainspring of
our life and activity. But I want to speak about Jesus' compassion to the multitude. He looked upon the people and they were
like sheep having no shepherd, they were scattered abroad and
He had compassion on them. I'm sure if Jesus looks at our world
today he must have a tremendous feeling of compassion for the
people scattered abroad. We don't read much in our magazines
about Cambodia now. Nobody cares to talk about it, it seems like.
But if you read the facts about Cambodia there is no question
what has happened. It's perfectly clear that one day the forces
of the Komer Rouge broke into the capital city and immediately
ord ordered everyone out of the country. They went into the hospitals
