The eyes are only one of the marvellous features or which many details are understood but the real essence is not understood by anyone.

I heard a doctor say once that 3/4 of the people who come to me -- 3/4 of the things people come to me for, I don't need to cure them. There's nothing I can do. He said, If I tell them so they will think I'm not interested and they will go to another doctor. So he said, I simply look very serious and give them some medicine to take, and if the medicine doesn't hurt them I'm happy I haven't done them any harm! That was a few years ago. Medicine has advanced since those days, but even so all that medicine has learned about the human body isn't a fraction of what we need to know if we were to handle these marvellous bodies in the very best way. God lends them to us for a time. We are wonderfully made. We are made in the image of God, but that's not the body. God doesn't have a body that looks like our body. We were given the image of God-- the holiness of God, the spiritual nature of God. Man fell, but he did not lose all the image of God. There is still some of the image of God in us.
