The largest would be 1½ acres; most of them probably smaller thank this. On that they are permitted to grow material for their own use or which they can sell in the Farmer's Market if they choose.

It said that only 3% of the land in Russia was in these little tracts that the individuals who work on the State farms were permitted to use for their own production. Butkalthough it was only 3% (the article said) 30% of the food produced in Russia was produced on this 3% of the land! by these individuals who in addition to that work had had to work a full day on the State farms. It sounds very beautiful. Let everyone work according to his ability; let everyone receive according to hisneed. It sounds very beautiful. Maybe our Lord will introduce a principle like that when everyone is Christian and we're all very anxious to do all we can for the general good

But even among Christians we are not sanctifized to that extentat least most of us are not. And the Russian people would starve if it werem not that in addition to what they grow on those great areas of wonderful land with the finest of new machinery to use, and with millions of people to work, they would starve if it were not for the tremendous amounts of wheat that they purchase from the U.S.A.

Sometimes you'll hear people say that 6% of the people of the world consume 30% of what is produced? Isn't it terrible! But of course the fact is the opposite. The fact is that % 6% of the people of the world are producing maybe 40% of what is produced in a Christian society in which the individual is regarded as important and is permitted to do the best he can and to reap the results of his labor, you have an incentive which produces results. Now everybody is blaming the big oil companies for the fact that we at present are having perhaps not enough oil. I don't know why it isn't the OPEC nations that get the blame! Just the big oil companies!
