

1 Cor. 15:54 Isa.25:8

Heb. He hath swallowed up death for ever, and the Lord Jehovah will wipe away tears from o:
LXX Death has prevailed and swallowed men up
NT Death is swallowed up in victory.

NT gives sense of the Heb. and substitutes "unto victory" for "forever"

1 Cor.15:55 Hos.13:14

Heb. Where are thy plagues, O death? where thy pestilence, O Sheol?
LXX Where is thy penalty, O death? where thy sting, O Hades?
NT Where, O death, is thy victory? where, O death, thy sting?

NT has "victory" where LXX has penalty and Heb. plagues.

The idea of victory is evidently suggested by the preceding verse from Heb.

Gal.3:10 Deut.27:26

Heb. Cursed is he who does not maintain the words of this law to do them
LXX Cursed is every man who does not abide in all the words of this law to do them
NT Cursed is every one who does not abide in all things written in the book of the law/
/to do them.

LXX has "every man" for "he" and adds "all" before "the words"

NT follows LXX with variations

Gal.3:13 Deut. 21:23
