The great amount of wickedness and violence that has plagued our world in recent centuries shows that completely fulfillment of all these purposes, except the third, has not yet occurred, and makes it reasonable to consider that the sixth statement points to something that has not yet occurred. An Israelite who read would have read the chapter during Daniel's lifetime waxxeextainly would certainly take it as pointing to the dedication of a new and purified city and temple.
