for Sunday on the previous Monday. I get them thoroughly worked out on Monday and on Tuesday I find time to go into the church and preach both sermons for the next Sunday, in the empty church. He said, I do that again Wednesday, and I do it again Thursday, and Friday and Saturday. On Sunday I go into the church early and preach the evening sermon and then the morning sermon. Then in the church service I give the morning sermon and then in the afternoon I go back again to the empty church and preach the evening sermon.

Well now he did not keep that up all his life by any means. But he kept it up until he gained a facility in speaking and in presenting things well and that was one of the factors that contributed verly considerably in an impact on many countries in later years.

Not procrastination. Not superficiality, but learning to sow as God wants us to sow and as we sow, so also shall we reap.

Another thing that is very easy to fall into is putting men's thoughts ahead of the Bible's teaching. I heard of a young man—I visited a friend not long ago and he told me how when he came East to go to school, to seminary, he had a close friend from college, a very earnest Christian who came with him but he was going to a different seminary than my friend was going to. He said how the friend told him how he went to that seminary and he talked with the Registrar and the Registrar smiled when he expressed his desire to make his life count to accomplish the utmost for Christ and stand for the Word of God. The Registrar said, Now you work hard. You work hard. You study and you will learn an awful lot that you don't know yet. He said that he went back there and visited his friend a year later and he had discarded all faith in the deity of Christ, all faith in the dependability of the Word of God.

He had come from a family and from a church that stood foursquare for the Word of God, but he went to a pac= place where gradually and subtely his mind was undermined because he submitted himself to the ideas of men instead of staying close to the Word of God. Putting men's thoughts ahead of Bible teaching is I believe one of the greatest ways in which Satan is misleading Christian people whether real Christians or nominal Christians today.

I picked up a book once. I happened to step into a modernist book shop and I noticed this book displayed and I picked it up and just glanced into it. It was called HOW TO BECOMEX A BISHOP WITHOUT BEING RELIGIOUS. It was written by a Methodist minister and I thought I wonder what advice he will give. I just opened it up at random and I saw these words: When you preach sprinkle very often intox your sermon the words 'the Bible says.' Then after you say those three words you can say anything you want. People will be impressed. But they will smile and be happy because you are giving them 'what the Bible says.' How terrible! The people wanted the truth of God. And
