not seem to me particularly important to try to root out from the membership of the organization any comparatively small number of individuals who hold ==who while ready to subscribe to the doctrinal statement of the Suggitz Society hold views and present papers that seem to the majority of the members to take a very different view. An occasional presentation of a paper of this type can be stimulating and helpful. To have many papers of this type would destroy the whole purpose of the ETS. Itxeen should be the responsibility of the program committee to see that such papaserpapers are comparatively fitux few but not necessarily to rule them out altogether. If one or more holding such views were to tend to oecupy a disproportionate amount of time of the in the meetings of **xx** the ETS or in its Journals and to bring in a considerable number of others who seem to the majority of the members to be fundamentally out of sympathy with the basic creedal statement of the organization, then it would be time for the organization that their numbers not increase.
