pages that went into all the difficulties that would be raised. See, I have spoken on Psalm 22 before a good many times, but my interest has been mostly in the lessons for us. Today, I put a little more strees on fulfilled prophecy. I'm ...somewhat. But, I think while speaking last night and today, I got some new insight into both of those passages. But just how long a book you would have to write to make it clear and not have some say that it's not a mistake but a gap, something you haven't gone into, people can **x** look at this silly fool making...where, with a little more space you can make clear what you mean. It won't wont be vulnerable. (If we have...) I believe his work is in that phase of archaelogically that deals with the study of the plan and the city and the walls and all that. Of course, it's a very **impro** (Discussion for the rest of the tape --not important for here).
