In the home we should learn many of the basic teachings of life. It is here that we may learn how to study the Scriptures, how to be unselfish, how to make right decisions, and how to deal well with others. The home helps us to grow in all of these things. But we must first have the right attitude of respect and love toward the home, or the help it will be able to give us will be slight.

In the light of this, what attitude should the young people in a home have toward their parents? Here many young folks make a serious error. Their parents are human beings, and all human beings are imperfect and subject to sin. The parents are seen to make mistakes, and the children feel that they may therefore themselves disobey the Scripture. However, two wrongs never make a right. The Bible is very clear as to the duties of children toward their parents. Three passages are particularly important. They are: Ephesians 6:1-3, Exodus 20:12, and Colossians 3:20. These passages should be studied carefully.
