

### #3 Dispensations

A. J. Frost (as given by Kraus, p.35)

Paradisiacal or Edenic

Antediluvian - Adam and Eve outside the gates of paradise to the deluge

Patriarchal - Noah and family to the bondage in Egypt

Mosaic - Moses to the death of Christ

Christian - "the dispensation of the Spirit"

James Hall Brookes(1830-1897) as given by Kraus, p.37-38

Brookes did not formulate a dispensational outline of his own but followed Professor Bayne of McGill University, who was a PB dispensationalist.

Bayne's outline was:

Eden dispensation, to the fall of Adam

Antediluvian dispensation, to the deluge

Patriarchal dispensation, to the fearful judgements upon Egypt

Mosaic dispensation, to the total apostasy of God's ancient people . . .

Messianic dispensation to the open rejection of Messiah, and his murder by execution upon the cross.

Dispensation of the Holy Ghost or of the Gospel

Millennial dispensation

Another outline - that of Clouser, which Brookes is said to have thought was the best he had seen up to that time is based on an explicit distinction between ages and dispensations. "In the dispensations, we read the story of God in redemption; in the ages, the ways of God in government."
