from her that he had led more than 50 young people to Christ. I don't know how many years he had had this difficulty in speaking. I never saw him again after that but when Stephen Christian in the spring semester to Biblical he introduced himself to me and told me that Max Stowe whom he had met at Harvey Cedars and he had kept up a correspondence and that Max had told him about me and about our trip in the mountains together. Later he showed me two or three letters from Max which, as he said, contained a good bit of repetition. EXEXXEREMENT Every one of them told about his contacts with me in past years. Eventually I heard that Max had developed trouble with his feet, and his wife was unable to take care of him, and she found that a Presbyterian, he having been a pastor in the United Presbyterian Church so long. the denomination would take care of him in one of their homes in Florida. They took him to the home where they cared for him and it was 30 miles from where his wife \* lived. Steve Christian visited her and drove her shortly after that to see Max and Max, they said, was constantly saying, "Why can't I be at home?" He seemed very unhappy there. The next I heard he had been taken back and she was taking care of him. Then I heard I got a letter from her telling me that he had died. I
