Said to be a kind of biography of Moses beginning with his birth and culminating in the covenant between Yahweh and Israel . . . Morgenstern's thesis is that the original K 'was a document of considerable magnitude, and that, composed in 899 B.C., . . . it is truly the oldest document of the Hexateuch'. Only a few fragments of it, however, survive in the present Hexateuch. Many of those that do survive are found in Eissfeld't L.
