p. 225 P's name for the ark is the "ark of the testimony" - the testimony being, of course, in this context the Decalogue. In P this title is used thirteen times, and is exclusive to P.

Gen. 2.7(J) says that Yahweh God "formed" man(using the verb <u>yatsar</u> which is also used of a potter's work), whereas Gen. 1.27 speaks of God as "creating" man (using the verb <u>bara</u>, which can have only God for its subject); in Gen. 15.18 (J) Yahweh "makes" a covenant with Abraham (literally, he "cuts" it, the verb <u>karat</u> being the same as that used in Gen. 26.28 of Iwaac and Abimelek), but in Gen. 17.7(P) the verg is "establish"(heqim)), which is without analogy in [the language of human covenant-making. For the sake of variety, P sometimes uses the older, commonplace language also (e.g., Gen. 2.2f.).
