p. 100 Within the Pentateuch D is confined, for the most part, to the book of Deuteronomy, whence its name, and is easily distinguished by its marked literary style. . . . As will be seen, later scholars recognized D in other books of the O T. As already stated, within the Pentateuch D is confined to the book of Deuteronomy except for a few brief passages in Exodus (Ex. 12.24-27; 13.3-6; 15.26)
