p. 19 One of the forces which have led to the re-dating of Love's Labor's Lost is the twentieth-century tendency to upgrade plays formerly regarded as unworthy such as <u>Titus Andronicus</u> and <u>Troilus and Cressida</u>; it is another brand snatched from the burning. In the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries it was considered poor and early. It is no longer considered poor and hence (small value in this <u>hence</u>) no longer considered early. Scholars have insisted, and rightly so, that it is poor only if judged by standards inapplicable to it.
